# How to enter Decimal Amounts on Cheques

Special rules apply to the writing of cheques as from 15th February 1971. The advice of the Banks may be summarised as follows:

When Handwritten :

Figures	Words
£29-00	Turnty-nuw pounds only.
(29-26	Townty-and pounds 26.
£10-05	Ten pounds 05.
£0-75	Seventy-five pence.

When Printed or Typed:

Figures	Words
(29-00	Twenty-nine pounds only.
(29-26	Twenty-nine pounds 26.
10-05	Ten pounds 05.
20.75	Seventy-five pence.

The following points should be noted:

## Amounts in Figures

A hyphen instead of a decimal point should be used on all handwritten cheques. This is to reduce the possibility of error and fraudulent alteration. For amounts under  $\int I$  there must always be a nought before the hyphen (or decimal point where printed or typed), e.g.,  $\int 0.37$ . For amounts of  $\int I$  and over there must always be two figures (noughts if necessary) after the hyphen (or decimal point), e.g.,  $\int 1.508 \int 15-80$ .

## Amounts in Words

For amounts under  $\int_{1}^{1}$  the term 'pence' is used instead of 'new pence'. Cheques drawn on and after D-Day can only be drawn in decimal currency and therefore old pence can never be intended. For amounts over  $\int_{1}^{1}$  where new pence are included they are to be shown as figures, as above there must always be two figures, *e.g.*, Seven pounds 65 Three pounds 07 Twenry pounds 20.

Please note that cheques must not be drawn in this manner until D-Day (15th February 1971.)
