DISPLAY OF NAVAL AIRCRAFT. The aircraft taking part in the Coronation Naval Review Fly-past will be based at Naval Air Stations on the South Coast, and those based at the R.N. Air Station, Lee-on-Solent, will be on display to the public on Saturday, 13th June. These aircraft will include Squadrons from the aircraft carriers of the Royal Navy and Commonwealth Navies, and also Squadrons of the Naval Home Air Command. All types of aircraft taking part in the Review Fly-past will be on view at Lee-on-Solent.

The Air Station will be open from noon, and entrance will be free of charge. Car parking facilities will be available, the charge made for this being devoted to Naval charities. Direct bus services to Lee-on-Solent are available from Gosport, Fareham and Southampton.

A static Display of Naval Air Equipment and Functions will be on view throughout the afternoon, and a programme of Flying Events will start at 2 p.m. and conclude at 4 p.m. with the start of the massed take-off of more than 200 aircraft for the dress rehearsal of the Coronation Review fly-past. This will be seen from Southsea Beach.
