Particularly the new rates of pay for Juniors as promulgated in the Military Salary make the introduction of this punishment appropriate.

1. Further to reference A it is submitted that the proposed punishment of a fine for Juniors (suggested to be additional to the present punishment allowed by reference B, Chapter 7.

2. The punishment of Stoppage of Pocket Money (No. 11A) is a token punishment with a short term effect and is applicable only to minor offences. The pocket money that is stopped is retained as a credit on the ledger until the Junior leaves HMS GANGES. Current rates of pay the following applies:

In order that Juniors whose pocket money has been stopped may have enough money for essentials, Juniors 2nd Class are paid a minimum of £2 per fortnight and Juniors 1st Class and 1st Class Star are paid £3. The amounts of 10/- and 20/- specified in Article 077 of Reference B are unrealistic in year 1970.

3. The proposed punishment of a fine is required for more serious offences. It is considered that such a step is not inappropriate because of the recent increases in pay.

PUNISHMENTS

The regulations in this chapter are reproduced from regulations made by the Defence Council under statutory powers.

0701 Investigation of Offences

Offences are to be investigated with meticulous regard to Q.R.(R.N.), Chapter 19, Section II.

0702 Award of Punishment

It is of the first importance that Juniors should feel that justice is being administered with the utmost care and that punishments are awarded only when thoroughly deserved. It should be borne in mind that an admonition (No. 15) can have the most salutary and lasting effect on a Junior who is not an habitual offender.

ATTEMPT

0703 Table of Punishments

The provisions of Q.R.(R.N.), Chapters 19 and 20 are applicable, the following modified table of punishments being substituted for text shown in Art. 1903.

No.

- 1 Imprisonment for a period not exceeding three months.
- 2 Dismissal from Her Majesty's Service.
- 3 Detention for a period not exceeding three months.
- 4A Striking of Badge Juniors.
- 9A Extra work and drill for a period not exceeding 14 days.
- 10 Stoppage of leave for a period not exceeding 30 days.
- 11 Fines for her Majesty's Service.
- 11A Stoppage of pay for a maximum period of 30 days.
- 14 Extra work or drill not exceeding two hours a day for a maximum period of 7 days.
- 15 Admonition.

0704 Striking of Badge Juniors

This punishment may be awarded only in conjunction with other punishments. It is obligatory when punishments other than Nos. 10, 11, 11A and 15 are awarded. Juniors identified may be re-advanced at the discretion of the Commanding Officer.

0705 Extra Work and Drill

The routine for, and the details of, this punishment are to follow those laid down in Q.R.(R.N.), Chapter 19. One hour should be given to parade drill during the punishment period. Rest on duty is to be reduced and privileges (e.g. cinema) are to be stopped for the duration of the punishment.

PLEASE

1. At E1 Commander-in-Chief Naval Home Command supports a proposal from HMS GANGES that the punishment of a fine of not more than 14 days' pay should be introduced into the scale of punishments for Juniors at Junior Training Establishments. The punishment would appear as 4B in the scale.

2. In support of this proposal it is pointed out that the new rates of pay for Juniors make the punishment appropriate and that, if introduced, it will be useful for more serious offences for which the minor punishment of Stoppage of Pocket Money (No 11A) is insufficient. It is intended that the rules for fining Juniors should follow those for adult ratings, but that the existing minimum rates of pocket money should still apply.

NOT

3. NL sees no objection to this proposal. Fines have proved to be a good flexible punishment for adult ratings and the punishment (with a limit of 14 days' pay) has recently been introduced into the WRNS' and QARNNS' scales. The advantage in fining is that it enables the Captain to select the right degree of punishment for a particular offence: other punishments are rather less flexible.

ATTEMPT

4. Artificer Training Establishments use the scale of punishments in BR 91 (Artificer Apprentices Training - General Instructions). Fining is not included in this scale and it is for consideration whether these establishments should be asked for their views on the application of the punishment to artificer apprentices. As both Juniors' and artificers' punishments are authorised by the same statutory regulations it would seem convenient to consider the inclusion of a fine in both scales at this stage.

1. Commander in Chief Naval Home Command has given his support to a proposal from HMS GANGES that the punishment of a fine of up to 14 days' pay should be added to the scale of punishments applicable to Juniors whilst at a Juniors Training Establishment. This proposal is supported by NL and DNSC. DNET has obtained the views of the Apprentice Training Establishments and agrees that the punishment should also be added to the scale applied to Artificer Apprentices in these Establishments.

2. The fine has proved a flexible and most useful punishment since its introduction in 1967 and has since been introduced into the WRNS and QARNNS scale with a limit of up to 14 days' pay. The new rates of pay for Juniors make the punishment appropriate to them and it is considered that it will be useful for dealing with more serious offences for which the minor punishment of Stoppage of Pocket Money is insufficient. It is intended that the rules for fining Juniors should follow those for adult ratings, but that the existing minimum rates of pocket money should still apply.

3. Submitted for approval to introduce the punishment of a fine of up to 14 days' pay into the punishment scales for Juniors in Junior Training Establishments and Artificer Apprentices in Apprentice Training Establishments.

I think this matter, which is an extension of the Punishment Code, should be seen by the Second Sea Lord himself on return.

2. The Command proposal is agreed within the Department.

3. I have had enquiries made about the position of the other two Services and I have been advised that fines are imposed on boys in both Services, although no special scale is laid down. We would not, therefore, be getting out of step if we were to endorse the Command proposal now.

4. Although **not** covered by the new Services Discipline Bill the question of minor punishments may well be looked at by the Select Committee concerned with the Bill. It might be argued that in these circumstances it would be preferable to postpone introducing fines for boys in the RN until 1972. If we were to do this, however, it would become quite clear that we are at present out of step with the other two Services and this might result in pressure on them to drop their fines.

ATTEMPT

5. On balance, I think it would be reasonable to introduce fines now notwithstanding the fact that the matter might have to be reconsidered by 1972.

If it is considered essential, as an aid to clarity, to quote the titles/subject matter of such references in the text, it will not be necessary to repeat the information in the footnote.
- (v) **Notice Board Issue.**—This consists of a list of titles and brief descriptions of Instructions which are of general interest to the Fleet. Drafts of such Instructions must be accompanied by a suitable entry for inclusion in the Notice Boards issue.
- (vi) **Foreign Navies Edition** is issued to Belgium, Denmark, France, Greece, Holland, Irish Republic, Italy, Norway, Portugal, Sweden, Turkey and W. Germany. The draft instruction must in all cases be submitted to D.N.S.Y. for prior approval before issue to these countries can be made.
- (vii) **Separate Issues.**—D.C.Is. (R.N.) extending to a number of pages may be printed separately where necessary and half-scale distribution may be made when this would meet requirements.
- (viii) **Index References.**—Index references should as far as possible accord with those of any previous Instruction (or A.F.O.) on the same subject and should be indicated on the index slip in the following manner:—

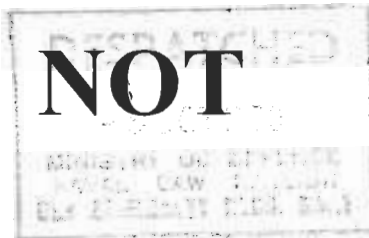

(AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1970**

The Defence Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 49 of the Naval Discipline Act, 1957 and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following Regulations:-

DO

1. The Regulations set out in the appendices to the Naval Summary Trial (Juniors' and Artificers' Training Establishments) Regulations, 1966 shall be amended as hereinafter appears.

2. In clause 6 of Article VII of the Artificer Apprentice Regulations there shall be inserted:-

NOT

"4B Fine not exceeding 14 days' pay".

3. In Article 0703 of the Junior Regulations there shall be inserted:-

ATTEMPT

"4B Fine not exceeding 14 days' pay".

4. The Interpretation Act 1889 shall apply to the interpretation of these regulations as it applies to an Act of Parliament.
