




# ARMED FORCES MEMORIAL

"A PLACE OF LIGHT, SPACE, AND ULTIMATELY PEACE"

The Armed Forces Memorial was dedicated in the presence of Her Majesty The Queen on the 12 October 2007. It provides fitting recognition for the British Servicemen and women who have been killed on duty since the end of the Second World War. It is not a war memorial. Alongside the names of those killed in conflict are the names of those killed in peacekeeping missions such as Bosnia and Herzegovina, in training accidents, or as a result of terrorist action. The names of over 16,000 people engraved on the Memorial are listed firstly by year, within each year by Service and within each Service in date of death order. The names of those who died on duty in 2011 will be remembered today.

The Memorial also recognises and acknowledges through the sculpture the courage of family and friends left behind. The sculptures were designed by lan Rank-Broadley. It is hoped that the Memorial will play a valuable role in supporting the bereaved as they manage their loss through different stages in their lives. The Memorial is independent, built on behalf of the Nation through donations and managed by a Board of Trustees. It is a place for people of all ages, of all religions or none, for those who hold military affiliations and for those who do not. Admittance to the Memorial is free though donations are welcome to ensure its future maintenance. The National Memorial Arboretum is open between 9am - 5pm every day except Christmas Day.
