PROTECTION OF SERVICE FAMILIES RESIDENT IN SINGAPORE & JOHORE BAHRU

1. It is of SPECIAL IMPORTANCE, from a security point of view, that where possible Service Personnel should NOT live in isolated dwellings or areas.
2. Many of the predominantly European areas afford the best facilities and are by far the most attractive, and are at the moment in good supply. There is no good reason why any family should live out on a limb.
3. Under no circumstances is any family to reside in the Geylang Area of Singapore - which is Postal District 14.

EMPLOYMENT OF DOMESTIC SERVANTS - WORK PERMITS.

If you live on Singapore Island the following WILL apply to you - it does not if you live in Johore Bahru.

Before you may employ a full or part-time amah, cook boy or the like - But NOT applicable to Gardeners (Kebuns) - you should determine whether he or she is a Singapore Citizen, this can be established either by birth or registration as follows :-

- (a) Any person who claims Singapore citizenship by birth should produce his birth certificate; you should check that the name on the birth certificate corresponds with the name of the identity card.
- (b) Any person who holds an unexpired birth certificate and has a Singapore identity card issued in 1949 or earlier stating that his place of birth in Singapore can be presumed to be a Singapore citizen by birth.
- (c) Any person who claims Singapore citizenship by registration should produce his citizenship certificate: the name on his citizenship certificate should correspond with the name on his identity card.

If you are in any doubt about the citizenship status of your servants you should write to the Commissioner of Employment, 23, Chatsworth Road, Singapore 10. (Telephone Nos. Singapore 646787 and 646788) giving full details and asking for a ruling on whether an application for a work permit is necessary.

HOW TO APPLY FOR A WORK PERMIT.

If citizenship is established, you can engage the servant when you wish without further formalities about work permits.

If the prospective employee is not a Singapore citizen he or she must apply for a work permit on Form C. You should complete Part II of this form yourself and send the completed together with two copies of a recent photograph (passport size) of the prospective employee to the Commissioner for Employment. You should not engage the new servant until the work permit has been received. It is important to note that any Non-Singapore citizen is required to apply for a new work permit on change of employment, so you cannot engage a new servant simply because he or she has been issued with a work permit in respect of previous employment.

Moving House.

If you move into a house and continue to employ the same amah etc, you may engage him or her immediately provided that a fresh application for a work permit, naming him as the new employer, is submitted immediately he takes over responsibility for payment of the servant. This should be done on Form C.

Servants Leaving Your Employ.

When a servant leaves your employ, you should, when making the last payment, recover the work permit and return it to the Commissioners for Employment.
