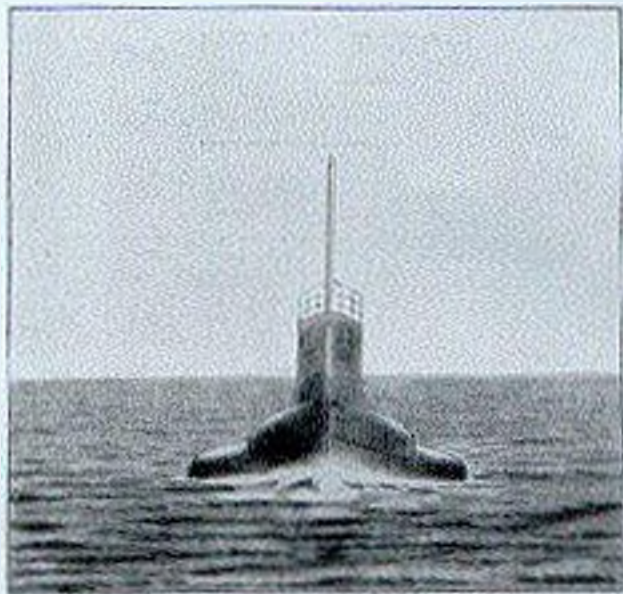

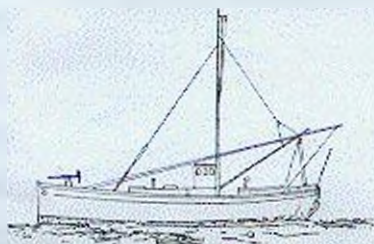

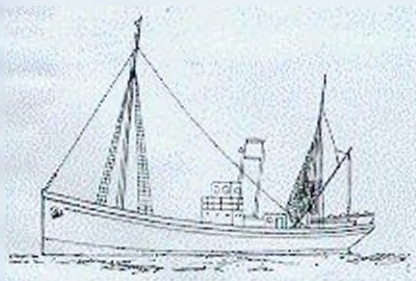

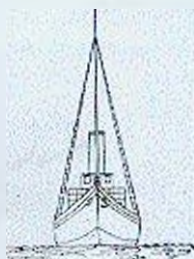

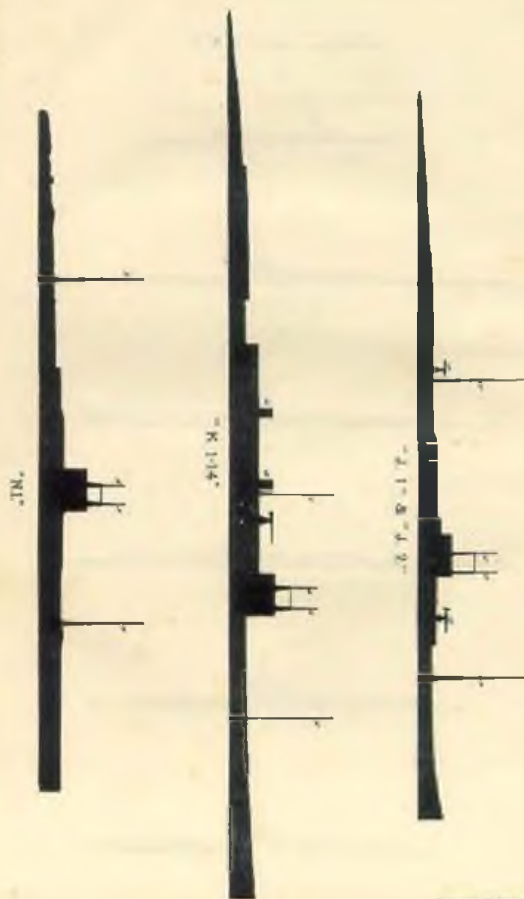

Disappearing

NOTE.

Masts, ventilators, periscopes, and exhaust funnels are hinged or telescopic, and may be either up or down when the vessels are on the surface.

A German submarine has been seen under way, submerged to base of conning tower, with her masts up.

Alterations, particularly as regards periscopes and exhaust funnel, may have been made in some of the earlier classes since the outbreak of war.
